“ Gerald and I met in Kansas City in March, 1966 as we both joined the United States Air Force at the same time. We went on to basic training at Lackland AFB, San Antonio, TX and then to the Air Force Technical School for Air Traffic Control at Keesler, AFB, Biloxi, MS, graduating in August 1966. Gerald received orders to go to Germany and I went to Okinawa. Our paths did not meet again until the 1980's when we both worked for the Federal Aviation Administration in Kansas City. Gerald joined thousands of his fellow air traffic controllers in the strike against the government in August 1981 when he and many others lost their jobs. Unfortunately, I have not seen Gerald since early 1981, though I have kept track of him through his cousin Jim Watkins, who also went to Air Force Tech School in Keesler at the same time we attended. I always meant to get back to Buffalo to see him, but never made it. Just another example of not keeping in touch with friends and loved ones before it is too late. I very much enjoyed my friendship with Gerald, we had a lot of fun together "back in the day". Our prayers are with Gerald's family.
