Gladys Mae Mullinix was born Sept, 11, 1921 at Louisburg, MO the daughter of Ray and Cora Mae (McPheeters) Karr. She died on Nov. 17th 2013 at John Knox Village in Lees Summit, MO at the age of 92. On April 29, 1946 she was married to James E. Mullinix and two daughters were born of this union.
