Loma Luvinia Pitts, daughter of the late Dewey Enoch and Lula Elizabeth (Black) Tate, was born on May 12, 1928 in Mohawk, MO, and departed this life on December 20, 2019 in Hermitage, MO. At the time of her passing she was 91 years, 7 months, and 6 days of age.

Loma was raised on the family farm near the Pleasant Ridge community and graduated from Urbana High School. After graduation she attended Drawns Business College in Springfield, MO. 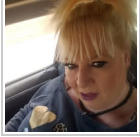
