Lowell Leawn Kahler, 94, Buffalo, was born Dec. 25, 1922, at Buffalo, the son of Mona Malcolm and Oda (Wilson) Kahler. He died Feb. 10, 2017, at Citizens Memorial Hospital, Bolivar. He grew up and lived his entire life in Buffalo, except for time spent in the military. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps and served as a flight instructor during World War II. While in the service, he was united in marriage with his hometown sweetheart, Nadine Farless, on June 10, 1944. After his discharge, they returned to Buffalo where he worked in his father's business, Kahler Electric Co., and later owned and operated the business in Buffalo until his retirement. He was a longtime member of the First Baptist Church in Buffalo, where he was ordained as a deacon on Nov. 6, 1955. He served faithfully in that capacity until his death. He loved the Lord and loved his church and did not miss an opportunity to witness and demonstrate his faith to others. He was well known and respected in the community and will be missed by all who knew and loved him. He was a loving husband and father and was always ready to help a friend or anyone in need. Lowell was preceded in death by his parents; his wife of 59 years, Nadine; his son, Timothy Lowell; his only sister, Noma Henson; and a great-grandson, his namesake, Kahler Dean Roush. Survivors include two daughters: Deborah Ann Edgar and Jeanette Lea Maze; six grandchildren: Timothy Mayes, Amanda Lorrain, Brandy Moberg, Holly Roush, Zachary Maze
