Richard Edwin Fuller, son of the late Edwin and LaVonne (Handeland) Fuller, was born in Brookings, South Dakota on August 7, 1947. He passed from this world on January 17, 2022 at Citizens Memorial Hospital in Bolivar, Missouri. He was at the time of his passing 74 years, five months, and 10 days of age.

Richard attended South Dakota State University in Brookings, South Dakota and earned a degree in music. He was married to Janice Kay (Eiseman) Fuller on October 22, 1966, in Eureka, South Dakota.
