Roger Allen Hilbrenner, age 74, of Urbana, passed away unexpectedly Thursday, September 9, 2021. Per his wishes, graveside services will be held at A.B. Union Cemetery in Tunas, Missouri with immediate family.

Upon graduation he attended basic training in Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri and then served in the National Guard. 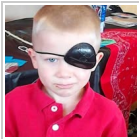
